	Does the community offer training and continuing education opportunities for staff?

	Would you be involved in decisions regarding changes in condition as they happen?			
	Do you like the policy the community has on communication with the family?			
	Ask what the community's biggest complaint is. Does the admissions director do a good job of explaining why it is a problem and how they are taking action to reduce complaints?			
	Will they make special accomidations for your loved one on an as-needed basis?
